SHEA'S SUMMER MUSICAL THEATRE INTENSIVE CAMPERS CREATED ORIGINAL MUSICALS

It was two weeks of accomplishment, fun, creativity, and confidence —The Shea's Summer Musical Theatre Intensive (SSMTI) had over 80 campers ages 9-17 immersed in day-long choreography, acting, writing, and vocal workshops across the Shea's Performing Arts Center Campus while preparing for a final showcase.

Campers, split into six groups, were presented with this year's showcase theme, "Creature Chronicles: Lost Stories of the Animal Kingdom." From there, it was up to their own comradery and creativity to develop from scratch their group's unique one-act musical based on the theme, which included an original song.





How did they develop their musical? Led by 15 local teaching artists, everyday campers rotated through workshops to learn and hone their skills.

SSMTI Camp Workshops

Research and History: Campers learned a dramaturgical approach to world-building for a musical to help them create their story and characters.

For Your Play: By focusing on different acting crafts, including stage composition, stage presence, improv, and ensemble building, campers developed an understanding of staging a musical.

Acting: Campers applied acting elements to their scenes and characters, supporting what they learned in other workshops.





RESTORATION WORK OF THE MIGHTY WURLITZER

Last summer, we introduced you to the esteemed David Peckham of L.A. Peckham and Son Pipe Organ Service based in Horseheads, NY. Mr. Peckham, a renowned expert in the field, has been diligently working to restore our Mighty Wurlitzer Organ since the project began in 2021. Components are meticulously removed and brought to his shop to be restored as per the Wurlitzer practice,

Over the past year, significant progress has been made in the Main chamber, with the restoration work shifting to the Foundation chamber. There are four organ chambers, two of which are located on each side of the house. The Foundation chamber is located above the Main chamber behind the house left box seat. Access to the chamber requires one to climb a large and sturdy wood ladder, making the removal and reinstalment process of components more intensive as anything large or heavy must be carefully lifted to the chamber by ropes and rigging.

According to Mr. Peckham, "the work in the Foundation chamber is very similar to what has been accomplished in the Main chamber." This work

includes restoring the bottom boards of the manual chests and expression (shade) actions and bumper pneumatics. Previous water damage was discovered, leading to expression shade bearings needing additional repair.

What follows are a series of before and after photos of components of the expression shades and the pneumatic action mechanism.



Expression Shade Bumper Arms Restored



Expression shades are enormous vertical wood louvers that can be adjusted by the organist to allow more or less sound to exit the organ chamber, effecting the level and timbre heard by the listener.

Like the restoration of the Main chamber, the next items planned for restoration are three wind regulators.

This summer, our restoration team has reached new heights to keep Shea's as beautiful as ever. During the months of June and July, scaffolding was erected on the mezzanine level of our Pearl-Street side stairs to repair cracks in the ceiling and walls. As you may remember from past editions of the Call-Board, water is the enemy of Shea's. The cracks in the ceiling and upper walls were made from roof water leaking down the interior of the wall.


