St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute Takes Gold in Shea's High School Musical Awards Program

Ceremony Held to Celebrate St. Joe's Awards in Seven Categories, Present School with \$6,000 in Grants Toward Performing Arts Program

The cast and crew of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute (SJCI) Musical *Guys and Dolls* were recognized during a ceremony hosted by Shea's Performing Arts Center. The school won in seven categories during Shea's High School Musical Awards Program including the grand prize for Outstanding Production of a Musical, which comes with a \$5,000 award toward the school's performing arts program, and \$1,000 in additional cash awards.
