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Shea's Performing Arts Center Announces High Schools & Adjudicators for Shea's Wonder Awards

20 Schools Eligible for Awards & Grants, Top Performers Will Head to National Awards Program

Shea's Performing Arts Center is pleased to announce the twenty high schools selected to participate in the 2024-25 Shea's Wonder Awards, a program designed to celebrate and support the arts in high schools, foster excellence in musical theatre, and provide valuable educational opportunities to students.

The program, led by Shea's Arts Engagement & Education Department, will include hundreds of students from 20 schools spanning 5 Western New York counties, including: Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Niagara. In addition to the competition, participating schools will receive unique workshop experiences and performing arts training. Participating schools are eligible to receive grants, and the top two individual performers have the opportunity participate in the National High School Musical Awards program, The Jimmy Awards, scheduled for June 23, 2025 in New York City.
